What's to see at the 54th Annual Detroit RV & Camping Show

Novi, Mich.—For seasoned RVers or people looking to get into the lifestyle, the 54th Annual Detroit RV & Camping Show, produced by the Michigan Association of Recreation Vehicles and Campgrounds (MARVAC), showcases a wide variety of RVs on display to suit any budget, outdoor interest or travelling adventures.

"Camping and travelling preferences can change over time," said Darren Ing, MARVAC show director. "At the Detroit RV & Camping Show, there are RVs there for every level of camping, from off-grid camping to family-size travel trailers to motorhomes perfect for a seasonal, or longer, stay."

Mighty tiny—The nuCamp line of TAG teardrop campers are the ultimate two-person sleeper. Weighing in at 1,400 pounds, it can be towed by just about any vehicle, said Matt Veurink, Veurink's RV Center. The TAG 400 offers a true queen-size bed, kitchen and a wet bath featuring an innovative, space-saving fold-down sink.

Time for toys—Whether you like to bring kayaks or ATVs, Harleys or pedal pushers, there is space galore for toys *and* family in the 2020 Grand Design Imagine XLS 24MPR travel trailer toy hauler, brought to the show by General RV Centers. A murphy bed and convertible sleeping system allows for comfortable sleeping for four while the 10-foot garage offers space and carrying capacity to bring along all your favorite outdoor gear and equipment.

Park it—Don't miss the stunning Kropf park model brought to the show by Vacationland Sales. Featuring a double loft, white cabinets and accentuating black-framed windows, this unit is a stunning example of available options for long-term stay or secondary vacation homes.

Top it off—Truck campers are very popular with show attendees. This year, four truck campers will be on display, including two from Palomino's Backpack Edition line, built in Colon, Michigan and brought to the show by TerryTown RV. The HS-8801 fits six-foot and eight-foot truck beds and the SS-1251 features a crank-up roof and partial tent sides for lighter weight and lower profile.

Over 350 units are on display at the show, including popular travel trailers, truck campers, folding camping trailers, motorhomes, toy haulers, fifth wheel travel trailers and a park model. Prices range from \$6,995 to more than \$400,000. With 75 exhibits featuring parts and accessories, campground information, on-site RV financing and RV rentals, there is something for every level of RVer at the show.
