ichigan in and of itself is a destination, with its vast forests and miles of pristine freshwater shoreline. Families have enjoyed exploring its environmental diversity for generations, whether they're permanent residents or not. But

there are also attractions and places worth

visiting that are not of the outdoors – museums, botanical gardens, lighthouses, and more that make for an enlightening, educational, and memorable trip. As you make plans and fill up your travel card, consider visiting one or

1. Southwest: Silver Lake

This gem known as the "Paradise of the Midwest" in Oceana County has something for everyone. A popular choice is to take an ORV or jeep - rented or your own - for a spin across the rising and falling hills. In fact, it's the only spot east of Utah where you can drive a privatized vehicle on sand dunes. Mac Woods Dune Rides is also around to give you the dune riding experience if you don't want to go yourself. If an ORV isn't your style, head to the water and enjoy some time at the beach after an invigorating dune climb. To pick up some fresh snacks to bring along on your adventures, visit Fox Barn Market & Winery, Lewis Farm Market & Petting Farm, or Rennhack Orchards Market for the latest in-season goods.

NEARBY: The Wood Shed Bike Shop has bike rentals for riding on the 22.7 mile, paved Hart-Montague Rail Trail and travels through several small towns.

▲ Northeast/Thumb: Tawas City

Have an "up north" experience on the Sunrise Side of the state in the Tawas Bay area. A main natural attraction is largo Springs, a series of natural springs originating from the Au Sable River in the form of small waterfalls. The springs can only be reached by taking the boardwalk and walking down 300 stairs, and when you reach the bottom, you'll come to feel a sense of awe and peace in the presence of the falling water not the mention the picturesque view of the Au Sable.

NEARBY: Alpena, a perfect day trip 65 miles to the north, is home to the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary and the Great Lakes Maritime Heritage Center. Go on a glass bottom boat tour and explore

3. Southeast: Detroit

When it comes to southeast Michigan, it's all about history, culture, and educational experiences. Though camping sites are null in the metro area, campgrounds are not far away in **Novi**, **Brighton**, and **Howell**. Visit The Henry Ford Museum, a celebration of our nation's transportation history and the visionaries who advanced us forward,



and Greenfield Village to step back in time and experience life of earlier generations of Americans. Kids will enjoy participating in demonstrations. You can also go on the Ford Rouge Factory Tour to get a closer glimpse at American automobile manufacturing. Other

spots to visit in and around **Detroit** that are ideal for families include the Yates Cider Mill in **Rochester Hills** for a delicious snack and a petting zoo, and the Cranbrook Institute of Science, Michigan's museum of natural history, in **Bloomfield Hills** for hands-on learning.

NEARBY: Ann Arbor, home of the University of Michigan, has a captivating history all its own and a die-hard culture for Michigan sports.

4. Northwest: Honor

Honor is a small village in **Benzie County** that is also home to the state's only drive-in theatre – The Cherry Bowl. Family friendly double features and old fashioned hot dog cartoons are on the big outdoor screen every night of the summer. Freshly made popcorn wafts through

the air around the cars until you can't resist anymore. During the day, families can choose to take a trip on the lower or upper part of the Platte River. The lower trip is the most ideal for families



because of its gentle current. It takes about two hours and ends at Lake Michigan at a sugar sand beach. The upper trip has a faster current and features more narrow turns to navigate, more suitable for families with older children. That adventure takes three to four hours to complete.

NEARBY: Other family activities include a short hike in the Trapp Farm Nature Preserve in **Beulah** and the dune climb at the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore.

5. Upper Peninsula: Sault Ste. Marie

Fifty miles north of the Straits of Mackinac, the Soo Locks have been a favorite family destination since opening in 1934. Nearly 5,000 vessels go through the Locks every year, traversing the 21-foot drop between Lake Superior and Lake Huron. There are a variety of







sightseeing tours and cruises, but it may be just as well to go straight to an observation platform to watch boats and freighters pass through and see the Locks in action. They are truly an engineering marvel that provides, according to the Sault Ste. Marie website, "a vital shipping connection within the Great Lakes." On the Canada side of Sault Ste. Marie (make sure you have passports) is home of Spruce Haven Nature Park, which offers wildlife viewing, petting area, nature walks, and a picnic area. On the U.S. side is the Tower of History, a 210-foot tower with open air decks and glassed observation areas to see the majesty of Michigan's Upper Peninsula from a unique perch.

NEARBY: Just pass the Mackinac Bridge is the Mystery Spot. What's the mystery? You'll need to stop in to find out.

Road Trip Games



To help make your summer family excursion the best one yet, MARVAC has complied five of our favorite, family-friendly road trip games to keep the kids busy while en route to the campground. These fun, conversational games will keep the boredom at bay, allowing the whole family to enjoy the ride.

- **1. CELEBRITY SOUP** Taking turns, one person starts by saying the name of a famous celebrity, such as Taylor Swift. The next person will follow up by saying a celebrity whose name starts with the first letter of the last name of the previous celebrity, such as Sandra Bullock. This sequence continues until someone cannot think of a fitting celebrity.
- **2. WHO ARE THEY?** This is a fun story-telling game that really gets the imagination going. The group selects a random car on the road and then works together to come up with an outlandish story for the people inside. Are they a team of secret agent aliens sent on a mission from Mars to steal the secret Big Mac sauce recipe from McDonald's? Or are they a band of traveling elephant trainers looking for an iHOP? Get as creative and descriptive as you can!
- **3. A-Z** As a group, decide on a topic animals, TV shows, song titles, etc. then take turns going through the alphabet naming items within the category that start with each letter of the alphabet. For example, you decide to go with animals: ant, bear, cat, dog, eagle....

To make it more difficult, each person in the car has to say something for each letter!

4. NAME THAT SONG — Each person takes a turn playing an obscure song from his or her phone or iPod. Everyone else in the car takes a turn guessing the song title. The first person to guess correctly gets to pick the next song.

This is a fun opportunity to reminisce on old songs, share funny memories from the songs of your youth, and get a better feel for the type of music your children like. Even your children's music is better than radio static, right?

5. I'M GOING CAMPING — The first person begins by saying the phrase "I'm going camping and I'm bringing..." and then whatever item they have selected to bring is based on a specific pattern or rule, such as only items that are blue or things that start with the letter "K." Everyone else takes turns guessing the rule or pattern by naming items that they think the camper would bring. The camper tells them if they are correct or not. The questioning continues until a person guesses the correct pattern or rule. The winner gets to plan the next camping trip.

Getting to the destination is half the fun! Whether you're all packed in a vehicle that's towing the family travel trailer or able to spread out in a Class A motorhome, offer up one of these great games to ensure a trip full of laughter and lasting memories.

Michigan has grown quite the reputation the past few **Northeast/Thumb** years, and wineries and breweries have sprouted up across the state in rapid numbers. Many of them also offer food, sometimes a full menu, so it's possible to take the whole family. Breweries and wineries don't just offer delicious,

locally crafted beverages, they offer a taste of local culture.

When it comes to wine, there are two northern Michigan counties that will knock your socks off: Grand Traverse and Leelanau. The area is perfectly arranged at the 45th parallel, benefiting from the landscape, freshwater, breezes, and climate. With around a dozen wineries in and around **Traverse City's** Old Mission Peninsula and more than twenty on the Leelanau Peninsula in the towns of Northport, Leland, Glen **Arbor**, and **Suttons Bay**, travelers have their pick of tasting rooms and wine varieties.

Southwest

When it comes to beer, there are two reigning kings - Grand Rapids and Kalamazoo. Grand Rapids was voted "Best Beer Town" by the readers of USA Today in 2014. Many breweries are within easy walking distance of one another while some require a little more travel to reach, although not much. You've probably heard of at least one of them: Founders, ranked as one of the top breweries in the world. Grand Rapids Brewing Co. is also the Midwest's first USDA-certified organic brewery.

wineries. Leelanau has wine trails as well, three in fact: the Sleeping

The "Sunrise Side" is less traveled than other parts of the state, and it's not well-known for wine and beer... but that doesn't mean they don't exist. In fact, the area is growing considerably in those industries. Just three years ago saw the launch of the Wine & Hops Trail, which covers a generous geographical area. The trail is a combination of eleven wineries and breweries as well as local attractions such as Charity Island Lighthouse in Au Gres and the Alpena Shipwreck Tours in Alpena. Most of the breweries and wineries are concentrated near the towns of Cheboygan, Rose City, and Alpena.

Kalamazoo is home base for Bell's, whose popular Oberon beer is a Michigan native's favorite during the summer months. Half of K-Zoo's breweries are within easy walking distance of one another, and the surrounding areas –

Battle Creek, Allegan, Marshall, Paw Paw - offer even more places to visit.

Wine lovers can head to the water to

satisfy their palates. The Lake Michigan Shore Wine Trail boasts multiple vineyards and tasting rooms, including Lemon Creek, Tabor Hill, and Round Barn, stretching from south of Holland to the border of Indiana.



Southeast

There are so many choices for beer in southeast Michigan that it's difficult to visit them all. Downtown **Detroit** and college town **Ann Arbor** – a 45 minute drive west – have the most choices. It's easy to see how Ann Arbor, and even nearby **Ypsilanti**, could grow such a scene. After all, the University of Michigan has more than 30,000 students. Detroit, despite all its troubles, is seeing a lot of growth and seems to be on the upswing. Brewers enjoy the history and architecture of the Motor City. To see everything that's available, check out The Beer Mapping Project, which lists every type of brewing operation within the vicinity of any zip code.

Upper Peninsula

Head to **Marquette** to check out the flourishing micro-brewery scene and the picturesque Lake Superior. Chocolay River Brewery, which opened in September 2014 within The Bayou Restaurant & Bar, offers five craft brewed ales. Blackrocks Brewery offers seasonal brews, limited

What is Michigan known for?

WINE — According to *Michiganwines.com*, Michigan grows more than 50 different grape varieties within the European, native American, or French/American hybrid categories. These plants cover more than 15,000 acres of vineyards belonging to 117 commercial wineries. The industry continues to grow and vintners continue to expand their offerings as well as produce award-winning favorites.

With part of the state at the 45th parallel, the same as Bordeaux, France, one of the best growing regions in Europe, the northern portion of Michigan is ideal for growing many European varieties. The most popular wines you'll see from Michigan include: Riesling, Chardonnay, cabernet franc, and pinot noir. Most wines are produced from these tried and true grape varieties. There are many native species, of course, such as Concord and Niagara, but they are used mainly for juice such as the sparkling wine of St. Julian Winery in Paw-Paw.

Hybrid crosses have found success in Michigan and are often used in blends. *Michiganwines.com* reports that Marechal Foch, which can produce a red wine as well as blush; Chancellor, which grows well in the southwest portion of the state; and vignoles, a versatile grape that can produce semi-dry and late harvest wines, are among the popular hybrids used around Michigan.

brews, and a standard flight. Their 51K IPA, heavy on the hops, was rated 96/100 by *Draft Magazine*. In stores, Blackrocks products stand out from the crowd by being in cans rather than glass bottles. The Vierling on South Front is home to the Marquette Harbor Brewery. One of the first brew pubs in the state, Marquette Harbor Brewery specializes in ales and lagers, including honey wheat ale and a red ale. Another stop to make is the Ore Dock Brewing Co. on Spring Street, which opened in 2012. The brewery has already made a name for itself. Enjoy both American and Belgian style beers that run the gamut: porters, ales, IPAs, and wheat.

Beer enthusiasts flock to Marquette in September for the Annual U.P. Fall Beer Festival hosted by the Michigan Brewers Guild, a good chance for anyone to enjoy multiple brews in one place. This event usually sells out fast so it's important to get your tickets online as soon as they are available.

It goes without saying, but don't drink and drive. Enjoy the bounty Michigan has to offer in the pub, at the brewery, or in the comfort of your camper. And make sure to reference the directory in this issue or use our interactive map on the go at **www.marvac.org** to find a place to stay nearest your chosen destination.




BEER — Michigan has the sixth highest concentration of craft breweries in the United States, a total of 159. These breweries produce more than 825,000 barrels of craft beer per year.

Even though everyone has their own opinion, you can expect to not be disappointed in your tasting travels. To help get started, *RateBeer.com* provided a list of 100 best beers in the world, and there were eight from Michigan. These beers include:

Several of the ones above are highly rated and ranked in Beer Advocate's list, but the top 10 are rounded out by Kuhnhenn Bourbon Barrel Fourth Dementia, Kuhnhenn Brewing Company; No Rules, Perrin Brewery; and Kuhnhenn Raspberry Eisbock, Kuhnhenn Brewing Company. Don't limit yourself. Ask the brewers and wait staff about their favorites and recommendations. Many will have seasonal or limited edition brews as well.

On an additional note, more and more hops are being planted and grown in Michigan, which means more breweries are choosing to source that essential ingredient from their home state. The largest one is MI Local Hops in Williamsburg near Traverse City, Michigan.

ichigan isn't just another state. It's a destination! Its location in the U.S., high to

the north, makes Michigan a place travelers have to decide to visit, and there are plenty of reasons to do so. DNR Advises Caution to Prevent Spread of Oak Wilt Disease

For most people, April 15 is the annual taxfiling deadline. For people like Roger Mech – and other forest health professionals – April 15 also marks the beginning of the yearly window when oak wilt can be transmitted from diseased to healthy red oak trees.

According to Mech, forest health monitoring program manager for the Michigan Department of Natural Resources' Forest Resources Division, oak wilt is a serious disease of oak trees. It mainly affects red oaks, including northern red oak, black oak and pin oak. Red oaks often die within a few weeks after becoming infected. White oaks are more resistant; therefore, the disease progresses more slowly. "The normal time-tested advice is to prevent oak wilt by not pruning or otherwise 'injuring' oaks from April 15 to July 15," Mech said.

He added that the spread of oak wilt occurs during this time of year as beetles move spores from fungal fruiting structures on the trees killed last year by oak wilt to wounds on healthy oaks. As warmer weather melts away snow and ice, the beetles that move oak wilt become active.

"Unfortunately, many learn not to prune or otherwise wound trees from mid-April to mid-July only after they lose their oaks to oak wilt," he said.

A common question the DNR is hearing this year is, "Can we push the April 15 day back a week or two because of the cold winter?"

Mech says that isn't an option.

"It doesn't matter how cold it was this winter," he said. "It only takes a few 50-degree or warmer days for both the beetles and fungus to become active. We have already had warmer weather in many parts of the state."

Although oak wilt hasn't been detected in every Michigan county, Mech said the need for vigilance is present statewide.

Spring is a popular time for people to move firewood to vacation properties and other locations. During this April-to-July period, Mech said that it's vital not to move wood from oak wilt-killed trees. These trees are often cut into firewood and moved, sometimes many miles from their original locations. Any wounding of oaks in this new location can result in new oak wilt infections as beetles move spores from the diseased firewood to fresh wounds on otherwise healthy trees.

"With the transport of firewood and other tree-related activities, you have to assume the risk is present, whether you live in metro Detroit or in the Upper Peninsula," Mech said.

The DNR recommends that anyone who suspects they have oak wilt-tainted firewood should cover it with a plastic tarp all the way to the ground, leaving no openings. This keeps the beetles away and generates heat inside the tarp,

helping to destroy the fungus. Once the bark loosens on the firewood, the disease can no longer be spread.

New oak wilt sites have been traced to spring and early summer wounding from tree-climbing spikes, rights-of-way pruning, nailing signs on trees and accidental tree-barking (a wound created when bark is removed via impact from equipment, falling trees and other causes). If an oak is wounded during this critical time, the DNR advises residents to cover the wound immediately with either a tree-wound paint or a latex paint to help keep beetles away.

Once an oak is infected, the fungus moves to neighboring red oaks through root grafts. Oaks within approximately 100 feet of each other – depending on the size of the trees – have connected or grafted root systems. Left untreated, oak wilt will continue to move from tree to tree, progressively killing more red oak over an increasingly larger area.

As more trees die from oak wilt, more spores are produced which contribute to the overland spread of oak wilt.

To minimize the risk of oak wilt infection caused by logging damage, the DNR prohibits cutting of red oak trees on state land between April 15 and July 15. This helps protect red oak trees left after thinning from damage that could lead to infection.

The DNR recommends private forest landowners exercise caution during this period and, whenever possible, delay harvesting activity in oak forests until after July 15 to reduce the risk of oak wilt.

10 TIPS for Camping with Your Dog

Make the camping experience with your canine enjoyable for all.

vacation isn't complete for many campers without a four-legged family member along. In fact, it's known that many people get into camping because they then have the ability and flexibility to take their pets with them on their adventures. According to the 2014 American Camper Report presented by the Coleman Company and the Outdoor Foundation, 31-35 percent of campers of all age groups went camping with their pets, with dogs the most popular type of pet.

Whether you're a first-timer or a veteran, it's important to remember a few important things that will help keep your dog safe and healthy, a joy to have along on the ride, and a good neighbor around other campers. Here are 10 tips for camping with your dog.

Safety and Health

- 1. Do make sure your dog's vaccines are up to date and all necessary medications are on hand. This is especially important for flea and tick prevention. According to an article by michiganradio.com, Michigan is in the midst of a tick boom, with ticks being in areas they weren't a few years ago and worse in the typical areas. This makes your dog more at risk to tick bites and Lyme's disease, so make sure your dog takes preventative medicine.
- 2. Do bring water and food bowls. They can be the ones from home or you can purchase lightweight, travel-friendly ones that can be packed up easily for side trips and activities.
- **3. Do** teach your dog *recall* and *leave-it* commands until he is reliable. This takes more planning ahead and training, before your dog is at a campground and needs to put his training to use. A recall command such as *come* or *here* or *back* is important for your dog to know because it helps prevent him from running into

a road, running after a wild animal, or wandering over to the next site. The *leave-it* command is also essential for safety. It tells your dog to ignore a certain object, such as animal scat or roadkill.

4. Do bring a crate or kennel. Your dog should have a comfortable



spot to call his own. A crate or kennel is useful when traveling to your destination, since he won't be moving about the vehicle and possibly distracting the driver (you know your dog best so do this at your discretion), or during a weather-related event he might find frightening such as a thunderstorm. When you're heading to an activity and need to leave your dog behind, a crate or kennel might be the safest option in which to contain him; just make sure it's not in a hot space and that the dog has plenty of water.

Along for the Ride

- 5. Do make sure your dog's ID tag is up to date with contact information. The contact number should be the most direct way of reaching you, and since you're a voyager on the road, it should be your cell phone number. Some metal tags and links have a propensity to bend or fall off, losing that valuable information. Consider as an alternative a dog collar with the name and contact number embroidered on the collar itself.
- **6. Do** your homework about the area you're planning to visit to explore dog-friendly places and activities. You wouldn't want to leave your dog behind in the RV the whole time, so take him along whenever possible. For hiking for instance, *Bringfido.com* lists all dog-friendly trails, beaches, parks, and more in Michigan. Most activities require dogs to be on leashes.
- 7. Do bring copies of veterinary records. If you have an emergency when you're away from home and need to visit a vet, having your records on hand will help them better understand and treat your dog.

Being a Good Neighbor

- **8. Do** follow campground rules. Some will have more stringent rules than others. Following the rules ensures a positive experience with a particular campground so that you'll be able to visit again in the future. These rules are also in place to help keep your dog and other travelers safe.
- 9. Do clean up after your dog. Bring enough baggies or even a scooper to take care of your dog's business. This keeps the campground or RV park clean, for feet and for the eyes.
- 10. Do keep your dog contained to your campsite. Campers are generally a friendly bunch, but you still want to keep your dog confined to your designated area. If you can't trust your dog to stick around, or listen to your commands, then tether him to a long lead so that the boundaries stay in place. Get to know your neighbors and how comfortable they are around dogs or whether they have dogs of their own.

Day Trip Checklist for the Dog

If you're planning an activity away from the RV that involves taking along the dog, then pack these items. Some items will be duplicated with multiple dogs.

- Leash
- Portable water dish
- Food (if out for an extended period of time)
- Dog boots (if your dog is used to them and you're going over rough terrain)

Extended Trip Checklist for the Dog

Upper Peninsula: Escarpment Trail





something for everyone. A downhill ski area in the 1950s, hikers can enjoy walks of 2 to 4.2 miles through moderate to challenging terrain. The gem of this recreation area is the crest of the hill, which requires climbing 462 steps to the observation decks. From there, hikers can see Boyne City, Lake Charlevoix, and, sometimes, a bit of Lake Michigan – and the majestic autumn cloak only Michigan can pull off.

LENGTH OF HIKE: 2-4.2 miles

BEST COLOR: Late September-Early October

Northeast/Thumb: Highbanks Trail

Fifteen minutes from **Oscoda** in the Huron National Forest, this easy to walk trail can be anywhere from four to seven miles, depending on how keen you are. The scenery is outstanding, the panoramas of the Au Sable River breathtaking, and the high points on the bluffs are mostly level so even children can enjoy the time on the trail. There are monuments along the way of historic interest as well


DIFFICULTY: Easy-Moderate **LENGTH OF HIKE:** Up to 7 miles

Tips for Hiking with Children

Hiking is an activity the whole family can enjoy, and with hundreds of trails to choose from, ranging from very easy to expert, families can challenge one another as the children grow and can handle longer or more advanced hikes. In the process, you see new places, connect with nature, and get some physical exercise.

- 1 GO EARLY. Kids are typically early risers and they wake up with plenty of energy, so put that energy to use by getting on the trails. Organize everything the night before so that you don't forget anything. Bring snacks for the time on the trail and a picnic lunch if you won't be back to the campsite before noon. Getting out early in the summer also usually provides more comfortable temperatures and the chance for some down time back at the RV or at the beach during the hottest part of the day.
- 2. CHOOSE A TRAIL YOUR
 YOUNGEST CHILD CAN HANDLE.
 This can be bothersome for older kids
 who want to hike longer or higher.

- Save those types of hikes for other times such as taking the older kids out specially, or save them for down the road. The exception is very young children, age one month to two years old, who can comfortably and safely be transported around in a front or back carrier.
- 3. trail with plenty of stops along the way such as waterfalls, rock formations, and overlooks to give your kids a chance to take a break from the walk, have a snack, and maybe learn a little history. Make sure all younger kids use the rest room a couple times before the hike begins -- there may not be anywhere along the hike to stop.
- 4. REPELLANT. Michigan has seen heavy mosquito and tick populations the past couple years, along with increased incidence of diseases those bugs carry. Older kids can spray themselves with bug spray on their arms, legs, neck, and face, while you'll need to spray the clothing of younger children so that it doesn't get on their hands and into their mouths directly. Sunscreen and hats will help keep your kids from sunburn, which takes all the fun out of the days that follow. The face is especially important to cover.
- TAKE YOUR TIME. Don't rush through the hike. Let your kids experience being outside, taking a look at flowers and leaves, and wondering if any animals live in that log. Younger children, ages three to six, tend to take their time anyway. Don't hurry them along. Encourage older kids to interact with their younger siblings by helping them explore. And by all means, take lots of photos! Digital photos can be uploaded to a photo website such as Shutterfly or Snapfish and arranged in a hardcover photobook, a wonderful keepsake of memories.



Understand what you need and what to ask when purchasing RV insurance

hen it comes time to purchase a recreation vehicle, whether it's your first rig or your eighth, a motorhome or a towable, it's important to take the time to properly evaluate your insurance coverage options. Protecting a home on wheels, as expected, is not as cut and dry as most insurance policies you're likely accustomed to.

Compiled below is a list of frequently asked questions that should help you navigate the winding roads of the RV insurance world.

What are my coverage options?

In most instances, you will be required to have, at a minimum, liability insurance – especially if you are renting – in case you are responsible for any damage or harm caused to other people or vehicles. Additionally, if you are financing your unit, most lenders will require that you have collision coverage for any damages received.

With that being said, you have two options in which you can file for coverage: add it onto your existing auto insurance or get separate RV insurance. If you add your RV to your existing plan, you will receive the same coverage benefits you had before. However, since your RV is more extravagant than your everyday car or truck, adding it onto your existing auto plan will make you exempt from coverage that would be unique to a motorhome or towable.

Most policies will cover anything permanently mounted to your rig, but you would be wise to apply contents coverage to your policy - especially if you're deciding to add your unit onto your auto, as most auto and home policies do not extend coverage to destroyed or stolen personal items that were in your RV.

Comprehensive coverage will protect you if any damages occur from just about anything, including collision, fire, flood, theft, vandalism, hail, etc. This is especially important in a state like Michigan, where weather can be unpredictable.

Full Replacement Cost or Total Loss Replacement Coverage is great to have for that worst case scenario disaster. This will ensure you are reimbursed for a like-kind and quality RV if your current rig is totaled. Many auto insurance plans will only reimburse you for the actual cash value of your vehicle at the time of the incident, taking depreciation into account. Chances are, you'd also have to pay a large portion out of pocket to replace your coach or towable.

Additionally, with Full Replacement Cost coverage, Gap Insurance will not be a factor. Gap Insurance is great for auto policies because if your car is totaled, a covered total loss, and you happen to owe more on it than it is worth, it prevents you from having to pay the difference – insurance companies will not pay you more than what your car is worth. But with Full Replacement Cost coverage, more specific for RVs, if you

paid \$100,000 for your RV, you will receive \$100,000 to replace it.

Q: What are some additional coverage features?

Here are eight items to consider:

- Diminishing deductible: Your deductible will reduce each consecutive claim-free year.
- Awning coverage: These attachments need frequent replacement.
 With this protection your insurance company will replace your awning for its actual value.
- **Storage:** This will reduce the cost of your premium while your rig is in storage.
- Single deductible: If you have a towable, single deductible will require you to only pay one deductible if both your RV and your towing vehicle are damaged.
- Vacation liability: If you are using your RV as a vacation home and someone is injured while at your campsite, this liability coverage will come into play.
- 24-hour emergency roadside assistance: If your coach or tow vehicle breaks down and you need a lift, this add-on will cover the cost of the tow.
- Emergency expense coverage: This will reimburse you for food, lodging, and travel expenses if your RV is inhabitable.
- **Pet injury coverage:** Insures your four-legged family members in case of injury.


Q: What if damage occurs while parked at a resort?

Nobody intends to incur damage. The greatest example of this is our aforementioned unpredictable weather; it is hard to prepare for a storm. In most instances, while parked at a resort or campground, if a live tree falls on your rig – damages caused that are not due to negligence – then as the RV owner, you will be liable. However, if a dead limb falls that the campground failed to remove prior, then the campground's insurance will be applied.



Q: What about when my RV is in storage?

Assuming your policy has not lapsed or been dropped, your coverage will remain the same.

Q: What if I am a full-timer?

If your rig is your primary residence, you will need to insure it with primary-residence protection, very similar to a homeowner's policy. This protection would be necessary in the case of an incident and you were temporarily unable to stay in your RV.

Q: How much am I likely to pay?

This question is tricky to answer, as all premiums are subject to differ based on your individual policy and provider. The make and model of your unit will also greatly impact the price. Your best bet is to shop around. There are about 10-12 carriers who specialize in RV insurance, many of which offer free quotes. Chances are unlikely that you purchased your very first motorhome or towable without taking the time to weigh the options, so use your honed skills of perusing to find the policy that works best for you.

Whether you already own or you're looking to invest, be sure to thoughtfully consider all of your options. Contact your insurance provider and determine if you have the right coverage for your lifestyle and rig, or request a quote to compare against other – even your current – policies. It's important to be safe and protect yourself, your family, and your investment against any

and all liabilities you could potentially face on the road.

Common Insurance Claims

A home on wheels is highly susceptible to numerous kinds of insurance claims – far different than what a normal home or auto policy can cover. It is important that you are aware of the most common RV insurance claims and how to avoid them. RVers are most likely to file claims related to (in no specific order) tire failures, damage due to low overhangs, animal infestations, and damage done to the body of the RV or towable.

1. TIRE FAILURES: The tires that get our RVs from Point A to Point B and beyond are essential for us to enjoy our RV lifestyle – and essential for our safety on the road. They're expensive, but they're a necessary part of our RV to monitor and replace as necessary. A tire failure en route can be a frightening, even life-threatening experience.

Always maintain appropriate air pressure to help extend the life of your tires and make them less likely to suffer damage, poor handling, irregular wear, or decreased fuel economy. And be sure to protect your tires from the elements when you can, as ultraviolet light, snow, rain, and other environmental factors can prematurely age your tires.

Be aware of how much loaded weight rests on each axle and wheel position, and try to have equal distribution, which may require moving around cargo or payload. Too much weight can overload what your tires can handle, leading to an accident.

And lastly, keep apprised of mileage and age. The average length of time RV tires stay in service is five to seven years, but it also depends on how the tires were used in that time.

2. DAMAGED ROOF OR AIR
CONDITIONING UNITS DUE TO LOW
OVERHANGS AND BRIDGES: One of
the most important things to know about your RV
or towable is its height, which should be recorded
in your owner's manual. Be cautious of low
clearances and be sure to take into account any
aftermarket add-ons, such as a satellite receiver.

A great resource to have handy is a road atlas, available in almost all rest stops, which lists all of the low clearance bridges by state – more advanced additions are available for purchase on sites such as Amazon and eBay. You can also consider installing a low clearance database onto your GPS or one of the many trip planning apps on the market to help avoid these obstacles easily because they are already taken into account on your route.

3. ANIMAL INFESTATIONS: This is especially prevalent when rigs are placed in storage during the winter months. With little to no human interference, your rig can serve as the perfect winter retreat for critters trying to escape the cold.

Be proactive; place mothballs, peppermint oil, and dryer sheets in or near corners, drawers, and other small openings to help deter mice and other rodents from nesting. Additionally, be sure to store food properly, keep windows and doors shut, power cords off the ground, and all trash removed. And if all of these preventative measures ultimately fail, try catching the little guys with traps or poison (but be sure to remove these before pets or children roam the rig). If you can't get rid of the varmints yourself, you may need to consider calling an exterminator.

4. BODY DAMAGE TO THE OUTSIDE OF THE RIG: Even the most experienced RVer can have trouble maneuvering a coach or towable. They are often bulky, hard to see around, and not as navigable as our traditional car or tow vehicle.

Avoid backing into objects by purchasing rear backup or side panel cameras – if your rig is not already equipped and especially if you're traveling alone. If you have a family on board, helpful campground neighbors, or office workers, have them step out and direct you into the lot. Be aware of your unit's width and turn radius as well, this will help you avoid any incidents while turning a corner.

The days of October are getting shorter and cooler, and Jack Frost may or may not have already made his first annual appearance. (In Michigan, that's a pretty safe bet.) Many RV campgrounds have closed for the season, while others have discounted late season rates and even winter camping availability. But if you're a seasonal camper, the time has come to pack away the RV.

Drain the Water and Dry the Water Lines

Water from the fresh water holding tank, black holding tank, and gray holding tanks should be flushed. Some RVs come with a built-in system, or you may need to clean them out with a wand. Don't drain the water heater until after you've added antifreeze. Once you've drained the tanks, open all the faucets in the RV, turn on the shower, and even flush the toilet a few times to make sure the water is all out. Next, blow

air through the water lines to force out any remaining water. Place caps on drains and close all faucets.

Add Antifreeze to the Plumbing System

If you have an RV with its own indoor plumbing system, then you'll need to add antifreeze. You can do this by using a water conversion kit or from the outside with a hand pump. Try to bypass your water heater, if you can, to save from using too many gallons of antifreeze. Turn on the water pump to pressurize the system. Move to the closest faucet and open the hot then cold valves until antifreeze appears. Repeat for all faucets, and then flush the toilet until it appears. Turn off

the water pump and open a faucet to release pressure. Pour a little antifreeze down each drain and into the toilet. Flush the toilet so that it gets into the holding tank. Consult your owner's manual for any other components in your RV that may require winterization, such as a washing machine.



Clean

Take everything out of the refrigerator and clean it thoroughly while you're at it. You don't want some old food or leftover sticky drink lying around for months and attracting pests. The same goes for cupboards and drawers.

Cover Vents and Holes

This includes the exhaust pipe, roof vents, fan vents, the vents around appliances, and wider spaces such as around doors. For some

areas, all you need to do is simply taking a sheet of plastic and placing it over the opening and securing it with tape (that won't ruin your RV's interior surfaces) or securing it beneath an existing cover; however, you need to remember to remove these temporary covers when the RV comes out of storage.

Rodent and Pest Prevention

Your RV is going to be sitting unattended for several months, making it the perfect winter retreat for small furry creatures. Rodents can cause damage to your electrical wiring and chew up curtains, seat cushions, and even the floor. Taking care of covering vents and holes as described in #4 will help, but you may need to get under your RV to look for small holes, about the size of a penny, and fill them with

aluminum or brass wool. Inside, you can think about putting out moth balls (there is disparity over whether this actually works) or setting traps, but your RV might not smell the best when you open it back up in the spring – peppermint oil may also provide a solution and give your RV a nice scent. The spring is when you'll need to worry most about insect infestation, including bees, ants, and spiders. You can place out bait strips and traps at the most accessible places. Cleaning your RV

well and tightly sealing it up will help with

preventing insects as well.

Fill or Remove the Propane Tanks

Containers should be topped off before being stored to help better withstand the weather. Shut off the supply and cover the tanks. Removable tanks can be taken off, covered, and stored in an area outside your RV. It's important to note that pests – especially spiders – are drawn to the scent of propane odorizer. Take away that temptation to help avoid their presence in your RV.

Battery Power

Fully charge a 12-volt battery prior to storage, and top off the water levels. If the climate is too cold (think Pellston), then remove it and store it in a warmer, dry place. Disconnect all cables and flip off the RV's main break panel. Unplug all electrical appliances, alarms, and detectors. If you have a generator, look to the manual for detailed instructions.



Long Live the Tires

Another one of our articles gives details about how to extend the life of your tires. Part of this life is spent in storage, and the tires still age even though they're not

in use. If you have one, use your RV's leveling system to offer additional support. You can also consider using outside jacks or blocks. If the RV is accessible, move the RV once or twice over the winter to help distribute the weight over the tire's surface.

Engine Maintenance

Top off the gasoline or diesel tanks and add a fuel stabilizer, which can be found at pretty much any automotive or RV supply store. Top off the radiator with antifreeze. Check the windshield wiper, brake fluid, and oil levels throughout the winter if you can, and top off as necessary.



Cover Your RV

If your RV is going to be left outside, exposed to the elements, or even if it's being stored in an old barn, think about covering it. You can use a tarp to ward off dust and grime and snow, but a more breathable material is more preferred. It will help keep mold and mildew at bay because moisture will be less likely to get trapped beneath the cover.

It's important to winterize your RV properly as well as employ some preventative measures. Don't take the easy way when it comes to winterizing your RV. Doing things properly in the fall will help ensure that it's in good operating condition and ready to travel when the season comes around again.

With these five new additions to your coach, you'll find the full-time lifestyle that much more tangible – if you haven't converted already!




